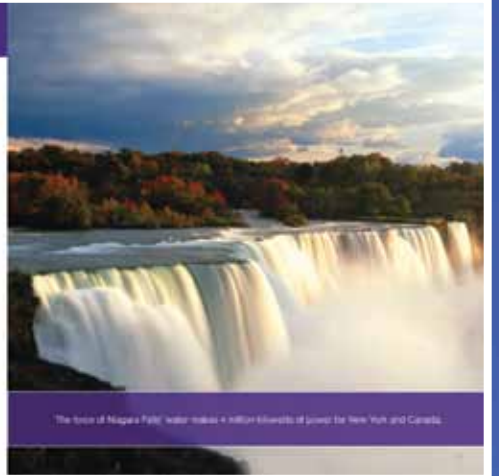

The Sunshine State

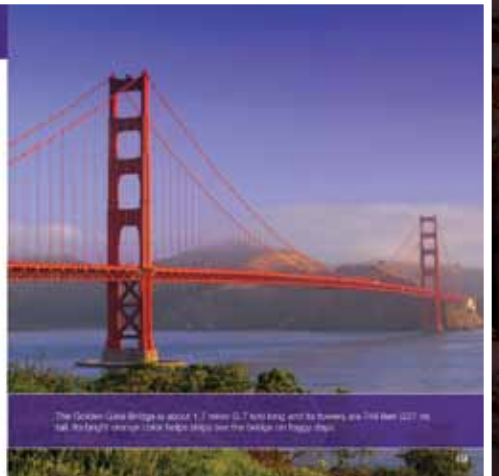

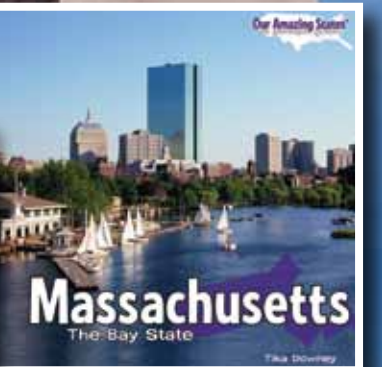
Florida is located in the south-eastern United States. It is the only state with a coastline on three sides.

The Bridge at the Golden Gate

San Francisco, in northern California, has one of the world's most famous and beautiful bridges, the Golden Gate Bridge. The bright orange bridge opened in 1937. It draws about nine million visitors each year. Like most people, you may wonder how the bridge got its name. The bridge gets its name from the strait it crosses, the Golden Gate Strait. You might think the strait was named for the goldfields nearby, but that is not true. John Frémont, a famous mapmaker and explorer, gave the strait its name because it reminded him of another harbor he knew, called the Golden Horn.



The Golden Gate Bridge is about 1.7 miles (2.7 km) long and its towers are 227 feet (69 m) tall. Its bright orange color helps ships see the bridge in foggy days.

Colonial Times in Massachusetts

The Pilgrims left England in 1620 to find a better life and religious freedom. Their ship, the *Mayflower*, landed near Plymouth Rock, on America's East Coast, and they built their colony nearby.

Life was very hard the first year, and many Pilgrims died. However, Native Americans helped the Pilgrims by showing them where to fish and hunt and how to grow corn and beans.

Over time, the Massachusetts colonies grew larger. They were still ruled by England, though. The colonists became unhappy with the laws England made for them. They wanted to make their own laws, but England said no.
